We have a jam-packed programme of events for you to enjoy during the summer, as Scarborough celebrates its 400-year anniversary of the discovery of its spa waters, which progressed to the town becoming Britain's first seaside resort.



Once again, we are thrilled to be partnering with **Big Ideas by the Sea**, adding a selection of archaeology, environmental, history and heritage activities to the season. This year's festival runs from **15-30 May** and features a 'Super Saturday' consisting of Peter Taylor CBE in conversation with former BBC Media & Arts Correspondent David Sillito, and Dr Harry Spillane commemorating the 500th anniversary of the first printed English bible.

This is swiftly followed by **Scarborough Streets**, across the town centre, from **29-31 May**. Expect singing, dancing, street theatre, magic and the odd surprise! There are also workshops where you can have a go at printmaking, dressing a donkey to take to the beach, circus skills, DJ skills, balloon modelling, and much more. SCARBOROUGH 400

2026 is a landmark year for Scarborough as it celebrates 400 years since the discovery of its spa waters, a moment that shaped the town's history and later established it as Britain's first seaside resort. Today, Scarborough is a lively seaside town with a vibrant year-round cultural calendar.

AQUA VITALIS

Artist Jethro Crabb has been commissioned to create a sculpture to commemorate Scarborough's 400th anniversary. The bronze sculpture, Aqua Vitalis, is due to feature a striking female figure inspired by Thomasin Farrer, who discovered the supposed medicinal properties of the town's spa waters in 1626.



SCARBOROUGH 400: MARITIME HERITAGE CENTRE: Until 13 December

Come and see this special exhibition explaining the past 400 years of Scarborough Spa and the town. Open Wednesday to Sunday, 11am-4pm.

GIANT DECKCHAIR TRAIL: 27 June - 31 August

Beginning at the railway station and winding through the town, this walkable trail guides you along North and South Bay to key landmarks - each one marked by a spectacular oversized deckchair, as you discover Scarborough's story. Start anywhere you like or follow the numerical order for the full storytelling experience.

SEAFEST: 17 - 19 July

A maritime weekend extravaganza, featuring some of the region's best culinary talent and a host of live music, is returning to the North Yorkshire coast. The festival celebrates the rich heritage of Scarborough and its close connection with the sea, and includes live music, street performers, art exhibitions, food stalls and plenty more.



A CELEBRATION OF SCARBOROUGH 400 THROUGH THE LIBRARY COLLECTIONS: 3 - 31 August

Join us at the community space in Scarborough Library for an exhibition looking at notable happenings in Scarborough over the last 400 years. The exhibition will tell the story of the town through the archive and local history collections held at the library.

SUNDAY BEST: 5 - 27 September

Step back in time at the Old Parcels Office to celebrate the tradition of travelling to the seaside dressed in your Sunday Best. From elegant Victorian promenades to the changing fashions of the 1920s, 30s and beyond, discover how a visit to Scarborough was once as much about style and social ritual as it was about the sea.

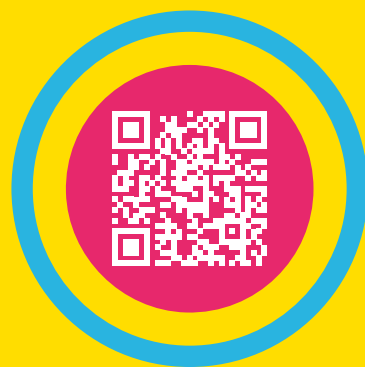
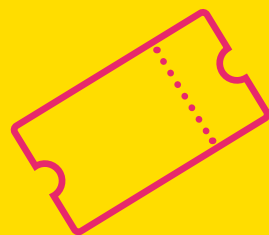

NORTH BAY PLAYHOUSE SHOCKER! PEOPLE SPOTTED ENJOYING THEMSELVES WITHOUT PHONES

What on earth is going on at the North Bay Playhouse in Scarborough? Eyewitnesses report an unusual development: groups of happy people gathering together to watch films, attend live events, and socialise without staring at their phones. Authorities were not called, despite the alarming nature of the situation.



AN UNUSUAL BUSINESS MODEL

Sources confirm the Playhouse operates on a people-first philosophy, avoiding films filled with pointless violence. Ticket prices remain low, staff are friendly, and the venue is described as comfortable and safe.



FOOD & DRINK: SUSPICIOUSLY GOOD

The Playhouse serves quality local ales, actually nice wine, and snacks chosen for taste rather than cost. Industry insiders are baffled.

INDEPENDENT AND PROUD

Operating independently without Arts Council funding, the Playhouse can show a wide range of films and host events for broad audiences.

A RETURN TO REAL EXPERIENCES

Visitors report rediscovering an affordable, relaxed, shared experience with other people. Experts warn this may increase happiness and reduce screen time.
